## dedication (Test C)

years 3 and 4 statutory requirement: endings which sound like /∫ən/, spelt **-tion**, **-sion**, **-cian** (dedication)

## **Common error**

22% = error with **dedic** 

Pupils who misspelt *dedication* tended to make errors with the letters **dedic**, by replacing the letter **i** with the letter **e** or letters **er** (*dedecation*, *dedercation*) or letter **a** (*dedacation*). Some pupils also made errors by doubling the second letter **d** (*deddication*) or adding a letter **a** before the second letter **d** (*deadication*). These errors tended to be made by pupils whose performance was average on the test overall. Some pupils made this error in combination with an error with the ending **–tion** as shown in the table below.

A smaller percentage of pupils made errors with the ending **-tion** when attempting to spell *dedication*:

error type	per cent of pupils	commentary and examples of pupils' misspellings
error with ending <b>-tion</b> only	7%	A small percentage of pupils misspelt the ending <b>-tion</b> , by using <b>sh</b> (dedicashion, dedicashun) or replacing the letter <b>t</b> with the letter <b>s</b> (dedicasion).  Pupils who misspelt the word using <b>sh</b> tended to perform below average on the test overall.
error with ending <b>-tion</b> <u>and</u> <b>dedic</b>	17%	deadicashon, dedecashun Some pupils combined an error in spelling dedic with an error in the ending -tion. This combination of errors tended to be made by pupils who performed below average on the test overall.
