

Privacy Policy

1. Who we are

This privacy notice provides you with details of how we collect and process your personal data.

MEI is the data controller and we are responsible for your personal data (referred to as “we”, “us” or “our” in this privacy notice).

By providing us with your data, you warrant to us that you are over 13 years of age.

2. What data do we collect about you, for what purpose and on what grounds we process it

Personal data is any information capable of identifying an individual. It does not include anonymised data.

We may process the following categories of personal data about you:

- **Communication Data** includes any communication that you send to us, whether that be through our website, email, text, social media messaging, social media posting, or any other communication that you send us. We process this data for the purposes of communicating with you, for record keeping and for the establishment, pursuance or defence of legal claims. Our lawful ground for this processing is our legitimate interest, which in this case are to reply to communications sent to us, to keep records and to establish, pursue or defend legal claims.

- **Customer Data** that includes data relating to any purchases of goods and/or services, such as your name, title, billing address, delivery address, email address, phone number, contact details, purchase details and your bank card details. We process this data to supply the goods and/or services you have purchased and to keep records of such transactions. Our lawful ground for this processing is the performance of a contract between you and us and/or taking steps at your request to enter into such a contract.
- **User Data** that includes data about how you use our website and any online services, together with any data that you post for publication on our website or through other online services. We process this data to operate our website and ensure relevant content is provided to you, to ensure the security of our website, to maintain back-ups of our website and/or databases and to enable publication and administration of our website, other online services and business. Our lawful grounds for this processing are our legitimate interests, which, in this case, enable us to properly administer our website and our business.
- **Technical Data** that includes data about your use of our website and online services such as your IP address, your login data, details about your browser, length of visit to pages on our website, page views and navigation paths, details about the number of times you use our website, time zone settings and other technology on the devices you use to access our website. The source of this data is from our analytics tracking system. We process this data to analyse your use of our website and other online services, to administer and protect our business and website, to deliver relevant content and advertisements of only our goods/services to you and to understand the effectiveness of our advertising. Our lawful grounds for this processing are our legitimate interests, which in this case are to enable us to properly administer our website and our business, develop our business, and decide our marketing strategy.
- **Marketing Data** that includes data about your preferences in receiving marketing from us and our third parties, and your communication preferences. We process this data to enable you to partake in our promotions, to deliver relevant website content and advertisements to you and measure or understand the effectiveness of this advertising. Our lawful grounds for this processing are our legitimate interests, which, in this case, are to study how customers use our products/services, develop our business, and decide our marketing strategy.
- We may use Customer Data, User Data, Technical Data and Marketing Data to deliver relevant website content and advertisements to you (including through social media adverts or other display advertisements) and to measure or understand the effectiveness of the advertising we serve you. Our lawful ground for this processing is legitimate interests, which is to develop our business. We may also use such data to

send other marketing communications to you. Our lawful ground for this processing is either consent or legitimate interests (namely, to develop our business).

Sensitive Data refers to data that includes details about race or ethnicity, religious or philosophical beliefs, sex life, sexual orientation, political opinions, trade union membership, information about health and genetic and biometric data. It also includes information about criminal convictions and offences. We may need to collect sensitive data in order to carry out contracts, or for the purposes of employment and social security.

Where we are required to collect personal data by law, or under the terms of the contract between us and you do not provide us with that data when requested, we may not be able to perform the contract (for example, to deliver goods or services to you). If you don't provide us with the requested data, we may have to cancel a product or service you have ordered, but if we do, we will notify you at the time.

We will only use your personal data for the purpose it was collected for or a reasonably compatible purpose if necessary. Further processing for archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes shall not be considered to be incompatible with the initial purposes. In case we need to use your details for an unrelated new purpose, we will let you know and explain the legal grounds for processing.

We may process your personal data without your knowledge or consent where this is required or permitted by law.

We do not carry out automated decision-making or any type of automated profiling.

3. How do we collect your personal data

We may collect data about you by you providing the data directly to us (for example, by filling in forms on our website or by sending us emails). We may automatically collect certain data from you as you use our website by using cookies and similar technologies. Please see our [cookie policy](#) for more details about this.

We may receive data from third parties such as analytics providers, such as Google, based outside the UK, advertising networks, such as Facebook, based outside the UK, search information providers, such as Google, based outside the UK, providers of technical, payment and delivery services, such as data brokers or aggregators.

We may also receive data from publicly available sources such as the Companies House and the Electoral Register, which are based in the UK. Other publicly available sources may include the UK government website, such as school performance tables and statistical releases.

4. Marketing communications

Our lawful ground of processing your personal data to send you marketing communications is either your consent or our legitimate interests (namely, to develop our business).

Under the Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations, we may send you marketing communications from us if (i) you made a purchase or asked for information from us about our goods or services, or (ii) you agreed to receive marketing communications, and in each case, you have not opted out of receiving such communications since. Under these regulations, if you are a limited company, we may send you marketing emails without your consent. However, you can still opt out of receiving marketing emails from us at any time.

You can ask us to stop sending you marketing messages at any time by emailing us at dataconsent@mei.org.uk.

If you opt out of receiving marketing communications, this opt-out does not apply to us retaining your personal data provided as a result of other transactions, such as purchases, warranty registrations, etc.

5. Disclosures of your personal data

We may have to share your personal data with the parties set out below:

- Other companies with which we are contractually engaged.
- Service providers who provide IT and system administration services.
- Professional advisers, including lawyers, bankers, auditors and insurers.
- Government bodies that require us to report processing activities.
- Those undertaking statistical, scientific or historical research, as deemed appropriate.
- Third parties to whom we sell, transfer, or merge parts of our business or our assets.

We require all third parties to whom we transfer your data to respect the security of your personal data and to treat it in accordance with the law. We only allow such third parties to process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

5.1 In cases where You are attending the Event known as “Problem Solving Matters”:

a) Mathematics in Education and Industry (MEI) may store Your data on a database in accordance with the Data Protection Act and it may be used for research and reporting purposes.

b) MEI and its partners will not use Your data in a way that would affect You individually. We will not release data to anyone who is unauthorised. Under the Data Protection Act 2018 You have the right to a copy of the data held about You by us.

5.2 In cases where you are applying for an On Demand Professional Development Subscription

a) Where an ODPD course is offered as part of a partnership with Imperial College London, basic data will be shared between the organisations, in line with our Privacy Notice. Such a partnership will be clear on the course page.

6. International transfers

We are subject to the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulations that protect your personal data. Where we transfer your data to third parties outside of the UK, we will ensure that certain safeguards are in place to ensure a similar degree of security for your personal data. As such:

- We may transfer your personal data to countries that the United Kingdom regulatory authorities have approved as providing an adequate level of protection for personal data, by; or
- If we use US-based providers that are part of a UK regulator-approved privacy framework, we may transfer data to them, as they have equivalent safeguards in place; or
- Where we use certain service providers who are established outside of the UK, we may use specific contracts, codes of conduct or certification mechanisms approved by the European Commission, which give personal data the same protection it has in Europe.

If none of the above safeguards are available, we may request your explicit consent to the specific transfer. You will have the right to withdraw this consent at any time.

7. Data security

We have put in place security measures to prevent your personal data from being accidentally lost, used, altered, disclosed, or accessed without authorisation. We also allow access to your personal data only to those employees and partners who have a business need to know such data. They will only process your personal data on our instructions, and they must keep it confidential.

We have procedures in place to deal with any suspected personal data breach and will notify you and any applicable regulator of a breach if we are legally required to.

8. Data retention

We will only retain your personal data for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, accounting, or reporting requirements.

When deciding what is the correct duration to retain the data for, we look at its amount, nature and sensitivity, potential risk of harm from unauthorised use or disclosure, the processing purposes, if these can be achieved by other means and legal requirements.

For tax purposes, the law requires us to keep basic information about our customers (including Contact, Identity, Financial and Transaction Data) for six years after they stop being customers.

In some circumstances, we may anonymise your personal data for research or statistical purposes, in which case we may use this information indefinitely without further notice to you.

9. Your legal rights

Under data protection laws, you have rights in relation to your personal data that include the right to request access, correction, erasure, restriction, transfer, to object to processing, to portability of data and (where the lawful ground of processing is consent) to withdraw consent.

You will not have to pay a fee to access your personal data (or to exercise any of the other rights). However, we may charge a reasonable fee if your request is clearly unfounded, repetitive or excessive or refuse to comply with your request in these circumstances.

We may need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and ensure your right to access your personal data (or to exercise any of your other rights). This is a security measure to ensure that personal data is not disclosed to any person who has no right to receive it. We may also contact you to ask you for further information in relation to your request to speed up our response.

We try to respond to all legitimate requests within one month. Occasionally, it may take us longer than a month if your request is particularly complex or you have made a number of requests. In this case, we will notify you.

If you are not happy with any aspect of how we collect and use your data, you have the right to complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO), the UK supervisory authority for data protection issues (www.ico.org.uk). We should be grateful if you would contact us first if you do have a complaint so that we can try to resolve it for you.
